Research your poster

Your poster can take inspiration from so many places, try some investigation first; consider 'Time' and all the different ways it affects or surrounds us. How could it relate to the science you have learnt about in or outside of school.

Why not think about your personal experiences of Time? From learning how people spend their time and how this might change through history to different hobbies and arts or crafts that you might have studied.

Perhaps you might think about the world around us. How do we measure time? Has this changed? What about the units that we measure time in or consider space or nature? Life cycles, life spans, evolution and hibernation could all be timely topics. Could you show how a type of technology has changed over time, or even the advancement of time-telling technology itself. Perhaps a look into the future could be worth investigating, what might it hold in store?

What about time travel in books, films, TV and music? British Science Week itself started back in 1994 - 30 years ago. Could you think about innovations in the world around us since then? What was life like 30 years ago?

Make your poster

Once you've completed your research, it's time to get creative! Your poster can be on A4 or A3 paper or you can make a model; you can use pop up pictures, pull out tabs just use your imagination.
