Letter from the Chair of Governors

Dear Parent/Carer,

I would like to introduce myself as the Chair of Telford Junior School's Local Governing Board, a role to which I was appointed in September. I have been a governor for 4 years and have spent my career working in schools, first as a teacher, then for the County Council and now as a consultant and researcher.

The Board works with the Elm Tree Multi-Academy Trust Board to oversee the work of the school. The governors are a range of volunteers with three important roles. We help ensure that the school has a clear vision, ethos and strategic direction; we hold leaders to account for the educational performance of the school; and we oversee its financial performance. We carry out this work by visiting the school and holding regular meetings with Mr Siviter and other staff. This term we have carried out visits to monitor the progress of the school's plans to improve English and Maths. We are pleased to report that developments in these areas are going very well.

Governors have a variety of skills and come from a range of backgrounds. This enables the board to have a broad perspective when considering issues facing the school. Several of the governors are parents and this helps us to know about any issues or concerns that parents might have. As a natural process of transition to the new academy arrangements, some long-serving governors have stepped down. These include Sara Maslowski, who did a great job of leading the school through the change process, and Martin Davis, another former chair, who had served the school for many years.
